Recent polls of those in the U.S. and European countries are showing a growing disconnect with the real meaning of Christmas. While a whopping 93% of Americans celebrate Christmas, "a rising number of Americans will have secular celebrations," according to a 2019 Gallup poll. Since 2010, those who say their celebration of Christmas is "strongly religious" has dropped from 50% to 35%. ¹

And while a 2013 YouGov poll in the U.K. found that 75% of those in the U.K. "liked Christmas," 16% didn't know the significance of December 25th. ² Their studies from other European countries, though, found that Christmas was faring even worse. ³



First Baptist Church Council Meeting

November 16, 2021

Previous minutes were approved.

Budget questions for 2022 were discussed. Concerns of the council were to leave choir and communion budgets the same as 2021.

JoDee said filling and donating "shoe boxes" will not take place this year because of the high cost of shipping.

Bob reported giving is not meeting expenses. First week of October, \$3000 was given and second week was \$3800. There was a balance from September, but Bob is looking forward to the time when giving is high enough when each expenditure does not have to be approved by the trustees.

Pastor John handed out information about a prayer tent. Training will be during the All-Church Retreat in January. Pastor mentioned the prayer service at The WELL at 2:00 PM Sunday, November 21.

Margaret thanked Pastor for being available for the community during the recent tragedies.

December 18th is the date for the live nativity event, followed by soup and dessert supper.

There will be a short business meeting to vote on the constitution changes on December 19 after the proposed changes have been posted for two weeks.

Sue mentioned ladies of the congregation are making casseroles for First Lutheran Church, "Come to Supper", meal December 7.

Children and youth are enjoying Wednesday evening supper and program afterward. Seven adults are attending worship service at the same time.

Pastor John closed in prayer.



Suggested Changes for Worship Board and Responsibilities

The Worship Board will have representatives from musical ministry, technical computer volunteers who are working on the presentation of worship services, and others who may be involved in the worship ministry of the church. This board will be responsible for providing oversight of all worship related activities and will work in conjunction with the pastor and his designated staff to accomplish this. The following are duties which will enhance the process:

- Pastor and Worship Leader will meet monthly with the Worship Board for the purpose of communicating themes and emphases of worship as led by preaching of the Word and leading the congregation in worship through music, scripture readings, etc.
- 2. Worship leader(s) will attend an annual conference (paid for by the church) focusing on the leading of congregational worship.
- 3. Communion...The Worship Board shall assign individual responsibility to various members regarding the preparation of the communion elements at all communion services as well as the scheduling and training of new servers.
- 4. Ushering...Recruiting and scheduling of ushers/welcomers for worship services.
- 5. Flowers and decorating will be organized by the Worship Board to coincide with the various traditional Church seasons including but not limited to Lent, Advent, Christmas, and will solicit the assistance of church volunteers to assist in this task.
- 6. Pulpit Supply and special services will be determined jointly by the pastor and the Worship Board.
- 7. The Worship Board will provide members of the congregation opportunities to share their reflections about worship services through the use of occasional surveys. It is hoped the completion and examination of these surveys may help enhance our worship services for any persons who may attend or watch online.

These changes for the church constitution will be voted by church members at an upcoming meeting.
