Honest Conversation with the Father



My soul, wait in silence for God alone, For my hope is from Him. He alone is my rock and my salvation, My refuge; I will not be shaken. My salvation and my glory rest on God; The rock of my strength, my refuge is in God. Trust in Him at all times, you people; Pour out your hearts before Him; God is a refuge for us. (Psalm 62:5-8)

Fairfield First Baptist is a praying church and a family full of people who pray. We pray for our own needs and for our families and friends, and we pray for each other. All of our cares are lessened as we come alongside each other whenever anyone requests prayer.

During my junior and senior years in college, I read and studied more about prayer than I did my classes. I read all the books I could get my hands on that were written by history's giants of prayer, fasting and revivals. I learned from great Pray-ers, like Thomas á Kempis, E. M. Bounds, Andrew Murray, George Muller, R.A. Torrey, Charles Finney, Leonard Ravenhill, Hudson Taylor, J. Edwin Orr, and others.

My friends and I practiced what we were learning as well. Two or three other guys would get together with my roommate and I in our dorm room almost every night during my junior year. I still have the journals filled with the things we were asking God to handle for us.

I have to confess, though, that, over the years I've not kept up that focus or practice of prayer. I pray, of course, but I don't have the same close connection that I once had. There are just so many areas that need to be attended to throughout our lives in Christ.

What I do know is that prayer reminds us more than anything, of our dependence on the Father. As David wrote in Psalm 62, "...my hope is in Him. He alone is my rock and salvation."

It's so easy, in day to day life, and even in ministry as a pastor, to put my hope in my own actions and the "human resources" available. These certainly are important for us to be who God is calling us to be and do, but we're completely bankrupt without the resources he provides. And it's our conscious connection with him, through the medium of prayer, that brings those resources to practical effect in our lives. Prayer is an acknowledgement of our dependence upon Him. It's important for us to fully grasp our complete dependence, and it's important for us to let God know that we understand our reliance on him.

This is one of the reasons I'm going to ask us to all make a commitment, in 2022, to grow in our commitment to prayer...both personally and corporately. I look forward to all of us getting better at talking, naturally, with God, and also serving each other and our community, through prayer. So, like David, let's pour out our hearts before him. Because he is a refuge for us!





GET IN THE ZONE FOR 2022!


Our kids' programs are up and running--and growing!

December 7, 2021

Deacon Guest, John Rathbun, reviewed Deacon budget for 2022. Previous minutes were approved.

General Fund has a positive balance of \$22,401.65.

HVAC loan is \$15,244.94. Payments each month are \$550.00. Bob Keller reported ceiling fans will be put in the sanctuary by spring to keep ceiling from building up condensation and dripping. Budget: We reviewed the budget for Director of Family Life, Secretary, Custodian, and 800's and 900's budget line items.

Mission and Evangelism Board December 7, 2021

Budget figures were reviewed and the explanations of new items were explained with questions answered as they arose.

Due to the retirement from Congo of the Chapmans (long time ABC missionaries), they will no longer be receiving support from the church and it was explained that in January we will select a new International ABC missionary to support. Pat will bring options to the Board from which they can select a new missionary family and locale.

A review of the year's work was undertaken and thanks was given to Board members for the responsibilities they had taken to ensure that mission information was provided through the church newsletter by articles about those who have received contributions from the tithes and offerings given by the congregation - both internationally and locally.

An update regarding Greg Lentz was provided. The Board had previously agreed to provide support for him when he arrives on the mission field in Nicaragua. Presently, there is considerable unrest there and Greg has tentatively set April 1 as the time when he will depart for Nicaragua. Support funds will not begin until he is on the field. At present, he has moved to Fairfield as he has sold his home in preparation for his move to Nicaragua.

The Board spent a considerable amount of time discussing the Evangelism part of their responsibilities with a variety of questions and comments about personal evangelism and the challenges involved. It was agreed that this discussion will continue when we meet in January and our new members are present so that we can set specific goals for the Evangelism part of our mandate.

The Board discussed the idea of focusing on food insufficiency in Jefferson County during 2022 and pursuing the idea of locating areas of underserved persons particularly in the outlying rural areas and directing some of our resources there. Specific goals will be determined at the January meeting. Mike shared his interest in pursuing particular unmet needs in the community regarding needed support and involvement in the local schools. This will be discussed as we begin our task in January 2022.

Line #301 is designated for John Rathbun \$10,000 deacon initiative 2022 and will be reviewed annually.
