

Therefore, as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude.

~ Colossians 2:6-7 NASBV



The American people have often been called to times of feasting and thanksgiving, as well as to fasting and prayer. Way back in 1621, William Bradford called the people of the Plymouth Colony to give thanks to God. Our Thanksgiving holiday was established when George Washington called the Nation to pray and give thanks, and every President, since Lincoln, has called a special day of Thanksgiving in the Fall.

From 1775-1783, while the U.S. was being formed, the Second Continental Congress set aside a National Day of Prayer. President John Adams established a National Day of Prayer in 1798 and 1799. In 1952 the United States Congress established May 5<sup>th</sup>, as the National Day of Fasting and Prayer.

Since then, for 70 years, every President has signed a declaration to the American people to spend time during that day to pray, specifically, for the health of our nation. This is, after all, the Biblical encouragement:

"First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, <sup>2</sup> for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. <sup>3</sup> This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior." (1 Timothy 2:1-3)

Let's think about how we might apply this call to prayer on May  $5^{th}$ , this year.

- 1. Some of us might want to tune in to the National Day of Prayer livestream broadcast at 7 PM our time. https://www.nationaldayofprayer.org/2022broadcast
- 2. Or listen on online radio: https://955thefish.com/
- 3. Some of us might want to go up to Des Moines, and celebrate on the steps of the Capitol building with hundreds of other Iowans, from 11:30-1:00.
- 4. Or you could gather with some friends at some point during the day to spend some time in prayer. You might gather over lunch, or at someone's house, or at the courthouse, or go for a Prayer Walk.
- 5. You might simply set aside some special time during your day, individually, to lift our country up to God.
- 6. All of the above.










#### **MISSION MOMENT – MAY 2022**

Well, it has been an exciting time in the past several weeks as we were planning for the "sending off" service and commitment of Greg Lentz to Nicaragua under the mission umbrella of Shining the Light Ministries!

This special service for Greg and for our church family was held on April 3<sup>rd</sup> in our church with members from Mt. Pleasant First Baptist Church and First Baptist of Ottumwa in the service and participating in the laying on of hands, which is the formal dedication of Greg to missionary service. Pastor John provided a challenge followed by Shining the Light Ministries, President, Jeff Schweizer, who gave welcoming remarks, Chuck Comfort, gave a personal reflection regarding Greg Lentz's journey, and Greg was presented with a check that covered the cost of a dirt bike for him to use for his transportation in Nicaragua upon his arrival. The funds for this dirt bike were provided by the three churches mentioned above as well as a matching dollar for dollar grant. Greg also shared from his personal journey. It is of interest to note that Greg is the first missionary to be part of Shining the Light Ministries. There are numerous news letters from Shining the Light Ministries in the narthex of the church and you are welcome to take some and read up on this Mission Organization that we are providing some financial support in our church budget for Greg's work in Nicaragua. A luncheon was served following the service.

Greg arrived in Nicaragua on April 21 and will immediately begin his "immersion experience" in which he will reside with a local family for three months and immerse himself into the culture, language classes and focusing on becoming as fluent as possible in three months.



#### **LETTER FROM GREG LENTZ**

April 24, 2022

Church Family,

I would like to begin by thanking everyone for your continued support and partnership in the ministry here in Nicaragua! I was able to arrive safely and get to my temporary living quarters before starting my immersion program. Over the past few days we were able to get the motorcycle purchased and have had a couple opportunities to drive the motorcycle. Thank you so much for the work that was done in raising the needed money for the motorcycle and the future expense of my immersion program! It has been quite a challenge adjusting to everything, but the support from our staff here has made things much easier. I was blessed to have the opportunity to make 3 previous trips over the years, and the relationships that were established proved to be very beneficial as I began to settle in for the long term mission. I did have the opportunity to attend the Children's Ministry in La Majada that serves 30 to 40 kids every Saturday morning. Pastor Angel and his family do a wonderful job serving these children and it will be celebrating its 1 year anniversary next week. I have been invited to attend and deliver a message for the kids and families that day, which I am blessed and excited to do on May 7th! I will be taking the next few days to finish arrangements for my immersion. I will be going to the school this week to meet with the teacher and get acquainted with the family I will be staying with during this 3 month period. My goal is simply to get more familiar with my surroundings so I can move around and get to the places I need to get to as I move into immersion on May 2nd.

I have placed things in God's hands and give Him all the Glory! Please continue to pray that God will open my mind to be able to learn a new language, patience, and continued direction in the ministry!
