Staycation Series *Update!

Last night we had our second **Staycation Event** of the summer! This one was called **Fun on the Farm**! We had a good turn-out with lots of good, relaxing conversation, food, and fellowship. Her prediction couldn't have been more "right on" over the years with the rise of the internet and binge-watching, and with Amazon and local grocery stores delivering to our door. On top of these trends we got hit with a pandemic, and we were told it was wrong even immoral, to get together with other people; even with our families at Thanksgiving and Christmas time.

Contrast 21st Century societal tendencies with those of earlier generations throughout human history and we find ourselves in what can only be described as social and spiritual malnutrition, to the point of starvation. If the people of the First Century needed to make a point of gathering together for fellowship, how much more do we?

During these Staycation Events we have a chance to connect with each other. We get to find out what's happening in each other's lives through natural and easy conversation. Our joys and concerns for one-another grows and we find ourselves knit-together with a more cohesive bond. We're strengthened to be healthier in spirit and we find ourselves enabled to better serve the needs of those around us.

LITTLE FREE PANTRY/LITTLE LIBRARY

The M&E Board, with the assistance of Bob Keller, has installed a Little Free Pantry and a Little Library on the west side of the church. While these two structures look similar (and will be getting some artistic flare from Amy Kermott), they serve two different purposes.

Shopping suggestions are posted on the bulletin board in the narthex. Non-perishable items (peanut butter, pancake mix, oatmeal, boxed/canned/bagged fruits, vegetables, pasta, protein, etc.) including hygiene items, are great for the pantry.

The Little Library promotes neighborhood book exchanges. We encourage you to fill the library with spiritual texts, religious-themed books, and/or non-offensive reading material for all ages.

Hola and Blessings! 6/16/2023

I apologize for the time between updates since my return to Nicaragua. There have been many things going on over the past couple months. As I mentioned in the last update I was working with Pastor Rudy in the community of Gracias a Dios on adding on and finishing the Sunday school classroom for the children. This was a project that Pastor Rudy began a few years ago and was never able to finish due to the lack of resources for completing the project.

Over the past couple months we have been able to receive some support for this project and began construction in mid-April. The process has been slow and we have made great progress in the construction classroom.

The construction of this classroom has brought new energy to the church. Each week the children are taught from the materials and books provided to them and I was also able to get some donated craft materials from another missionary here in Nicaragua. They are also provided with a small meal and snack after their teaching.

We have also been continuing our work in Las Parcelas with Pastor Pedro and the children's ministry. This ministry has become very strong and has brought the congregation closer expanding into the community where we have families with gardens to help with the food needed for the children. Pastor Pedro had a few chickens that roamed the property so we fixed his chicken coop and gathered all the chickens up so we could begin gathering eggs to help in feeding the children. He started with 12 chickens and we provide food for the chickens to help in egg production. Over the past couple months this project has become very successful. Pastor Pedro has used the eggs for his family and the children's ministry. He has also had eggs left that he has been able to sell along with some of the tomatoes and peppers from the garden. With the money he was able to make, Pedro utilized for the purchase of 5 more laying hens to help increase the production. Pastor Pedro is now able to buy his own feed for the chickens because of the increase in eggs, produce sales, church offering, and our weekly love offering. This ministry is not completely self-sustainable yet, but continues to make progress in accomplishing this goal for the ministry. We continue to have 40 to 45 kids each Wednesday afternoon. Since the start of this ministry we have been able to serve 1,272 meals to the children. I have spent time with Pastor Pedro and the congregation as I have continued to teach about stewardship and the responsibility we have as stewards

with the provision that God has provided to this ministry and the church.

Pastor Pedro, Pastor Rudy, the children and myself are truly grateful for the support that has been received to keep Pastor Pedro's children's ministry going and establishing the classroom for the children at Pastor Rudy's Church. The kitchen and classrooms are the foundations that have allowed us to establish these ministries. We have seen the growth and commitment these Pastors have to share the Word of God to these children and empower the people of the congregations to serve God through these ministries.

We still have some more work to do at the church in Gracias a Dios as we are looking to put in a new latrine with proper waste management. The space is very limited and the ability to dig a hole and keep moving it is not a feasible long term solution. I have had an opportunity to see a septic system built in another community that we are currently exploring and evaluating the space needed for installation.

I will be continuing to work with Pastor Rudy to explore solutions to this problem along with continued support to finish up the classroom and build this ministry with educational supplies. Windows for the classroom will be purchased in the coming week and installed. As I am able to gather more information concerning the latrine / bathroom I will share with everyone.

Once again thanks everyone for your support and prayer! It is a blessing for me to be here serving God and working with and empowering these pastors to follow through on the vision God had

placed on their hearts with your loving support! Bendiciones!
