

"Solid food is for those who are mature, who through training have the skill to recognize the difference between right and wrong. (Hebrews 5:14)

'Tis the season for graduations. (Fa la la la la, la la la la. ♪ ℷℷ) Each spring we celebrate with family and friends when a loved one is graduating from high school or college. Our church family is celebrating Erin Epperson and Lacey Wilson's graduation from high school, among others, this year. Congratulations, ladies!!

When I was young my family moved to Walworth, WI, just in time for me to get in on their tradition of having a graduation from 8th Grade into High School. One town we lived in celebrated kindergarten graduation. Whatever the level, moving on from one step to the next is always a great accomplishment and should be celebrated! This is true, even if, like some of us, we barely skimmed by, yet somehow got moved on, (probably so the teacher didn't have to put up with us for the next year.)

Life is a series of graduations.

We may not be involved in formal education anymore, but that doesn't mean we're done receiving instruction. In fact, I believe the very point of our existence is to go through a curriculum of learning that God laid out for us before we were even created. That curriculum is different for every one of us, but the path is the same: learn the stuff he puts in front of us in the form of our circumstances and experiences and graduate on to the next level of maturity toward Christlikeness.

That's what Paul told the church family in Corinth,

(2 Cor. 3:18 ESV)

Maybe, you have lived in fear and anxiety over the ways your life, or the life of a loved one, could seem to come to harm, and you finally gave yourself up to completely trust him to provide for you, regardless of the difficulty. Some of these steps, maybe most, won't even be perceptible, it may be the Father has worked on us at the subconscious level, but we can always celebrate all of God's lessons and the ways he's growing us up.

One other cool thing is that he says we can join him in helping others in their spiritual education!

"He is the one we proclaim, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone fully mature in Christ."

(Col. 1:28 NIV)

A Message from Greg Lentz...Shining the Light Ministries

I spent the 1st $\frac{1}{2}$ of the month back home visiting churches and family. I appreciate everyone that took the time to spend time with me and share my experiences during my 1st 9 to 10 months here in Nicaragua. Also a special thanks to all those who helped in a variety of different ways from financially, to supplying me with a vehicle while I was there, so I was able to accomplish everything that I needed to do while I was back home.

While I was home, Pastor Pedro, in Las Parcelas, continued his work with the children and pastoring his church. The children's ministry on Wednesday continued to grow and we are continuing to move forward in this ministry. The construction of the kitchen has been a strong foundation for stabilizing this ministry and providing opportunity for continued ministry.

We are averaging 45 children every Wednesday afternoon. The children are being provided an opportunity to worship, learn, and practice in prayer. It has also been an opportunity for parents and adults in the community to share the gifts that have been given to them by God in the help they provide to make the ministry functional. There was also a challenge in mid-January to the congregation to have 4 families or people to begin growing gardens at their homes to help provide valuable vegetables to the meals being provided to the children. Upon my return, there were 2 gardens already started with two others needing seeds to begin growing the gardens. Seeds and fertilizer were provided and have been placed in seed beds.

I was able to meet with Pastor Rudy from Gracias a Dios last year while I was working with Pastor Pedro and his children's ministry. This last week I was able to meet with Pastor Rudy and revisit our previous

conversation with him. Pastor Rudy Church began a project 4 years ago that was going to be an addition to the church to provide a place for the children to go to receive their lesson during the church service on Sundays. They began taking offering through the church to complete this construction and simple was not able to raise enough money for the construction. They were able to raise some and began construction but it has never been completed. The children receive teaching every Sunday, but it is outside and weather permitting. The completion of this project would be a great blessing to the church and the children of this church. This is a picture of how far they were able to get on the addition to the church for the children.

Along with the completion of this construction there are needs for a variety of teaching materials needed to assist in the teaching every Sunday. We have provided some books to help in the teaching of the

children and to help organize the Pastor and teacher future Sunday teachings. To finish this construction and get the needed supplies to help in the teaching of the children we would need \$2500.00. I ask you to join Pastor Rudy and me as we continue to pray for the vision and ministry moving forward.

It was my 1st time at this ministry last week. I was able to spend some time with the Pastor on one day and then actually attend the ministry on another day. This is a fairly large ministry that serves and teaches children 3 times per week. When I attended there were roughly 50 children in attendance. Along with the children there were roughly 15 adults that were elderly or pregnant women from the community that also received a meal after the time of teaching for the children. A rice / soy blend is provided to help in the feeding of these people from Ocar who meet with pastors once a month who are feeding children. As long as the pastor attends that meeting to provide feedback on their ministry they provide this rice / soy blend to feed the children, and other vegetables to be added to the meal for more nutrition. The pastor is responsible for all other items they wish to feed the children. On the day I was there, there was a little chicken, vegetable, and plantain mixed into the rice / soy mix to try to add a little flavor and added nutrition. There is also the added cost of things like oil. To be able to provide what they have been adding to the rice / soy has been \$12 to \$15 a meal.

This children ministry just began a month or so ago and has the potential to reach many children. During this time with the children they take time for an activity which includes singing and a chance for the children to actively participate. There is also a time for teaching with this week's teaching being about the story of Jonah. It is after the teaching that there is prayer and the time for the meal. Some of the needs that were mentioned were things like books to help them teach, which I provided for them. There are also needs for things like glasses, plates, oil, chicken, and other vegetables to be added to the meal for more nutrition. We had 4 baptisms in mid-March which is a testimony to the work Pastor Pedro is doing in the community with the gifts and resources being provided through Christ.

The other two communities are new projects that I will be continuing to work with over the next few months and look forward to sharing the progress of all of these ministries in the coming months!

The board is trying to get the speakers in the narthex working for pre-service music. There is a list of secret greeters being put together. A lot of ideas came out of the worship survey.

<u>Mission & Evangelism Board</u> – Virgil Symmonds talked about ways to serve the community such as soup kitchen, community meals, etc.

<u>Christian Education Board</u> – Ted Munson said Wednesday night was a success. He gave a lot of credit to Sarah Stiemsma. In the fall, they will be doing meals on Wednesday nights again and asked for volunteers.

<u>Trustee Board</u> – Ray Woody said work week at Forest Lake Camp got a lot accomplished. Trustees are working on insurance policy renewal and getting quotes from another company for comparison.

<u>Financial Report</u> – Ray Woody reported that we maintained status quo and holding our own for the last six months.

<u>Pastor's Report</u> – Pastor John Kermott said we're going in a good way and doing a lot for our size of church. Our church ranked #78 out of about 5000 churches in giving to United Missions!

There will be a Pizza Pow-wow on May 7th after Worship to get ideas for our children's and youth programs. All are welcome and encouraged to attend. The Fun Team will be doing more planning on future fun family activities.

Pastor John closed the meeting with prayer.
