

"Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away." - Jesus (Matthew 24:35)

Could you imagine what it would be like if we didn't have a Bible in English? Wycliffe Bible Translators have a goal to translate the Bible for the people of every spoken language on earth.

"In 1917, a missionary named William Cameron Townsend went to Guatemala to sell Spanish Bibles. He was shocked when many people couldn't understand the books, but soon realized they spoke Cakchiquel, a language without a Bible. With the goal that everyone should be able to read the Bible in their own language and understanding, Townsend started a school to train people to do Bible translation. In 1942, Townsend and Rev. L.L. Legters founded Wycliffe Bible Translators. In the year 2000, Wycliffe would celebrate having translated the Bible into 500 languages. Their work continues. Wycliffe has set its sights on

beginning a translation project in every language in the world – that's more than 2000 languages – by the year 2025." (Source: www.museumofthebible.org)

One of the difficulties Bible translators ran into was coming across many languages that had never had a written form. Wycliffe linguists would then talk with the leaders of that people group, study the spoken language, and devise an alphabet and grammar system for that language. These people groups have benefited from Wycliffe staff in that they've become literate, and now have the joy of being able to read God's word for themselves! These are the kinds of blessings that God is providing to the world through those who love him.



Amy and I have known Tom and Sharon Jacob for many years. Tom is a Translation Consultant, working with translators across Africa, to bring God's word to unreached people groups.

Sharon is an Exegetical Advisor, meaning that she helps the native speakers to understand the culture of the Bible times so they can match up the Biblical concepts to their present language. The Jacobs' are in the front-line trenches, getting the written word of God out to the world. I can't imagine a more rewarding work than theirs!

Would you take a minute, right now, to pray for the Bible translators around the world, like Tom and Sharon? Ask the Father to give them perseverance to complete the work, and then ask him to open the eyes of those who read so they can know him, and Jesus Christ, whom He has sent!
