FFFBC 2025 Theme Sowing Seed

"Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. "As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. "Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. "But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root." Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. "Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. "Whoever has ears, let them hear." (Matthew 13:3-9)

I would like to use "The Parable of the Sower and the Seed" as the theme for our church family for 2025. In this newsletter article I want to just get you started thinking about what this could mean for Fairfield First Baptist in the coming year.

I'd like to start by clarifying what it means to "sow seed". We're all familiar with what farmers do in the spring as they plant the seed in hopes of reaping a good crop in the fall. The words "sow" and "plant" are often used interchangeably to describe that process but there is a slight definitional difference. To plant something there's the sense the seed is placed in the ground and covered with soil. There's an intentional placement of the seed and often it's put in a row for easier harvesting. Sowing, though, has a sense of being less iitentional about the placement of the seed and more indiscriminate. One who sows just throws the seed out, in front and around themselves.

I've often wondered about this parable and thought, "Why wasn't the sower more careful about where the seed went?" It seems like the sower was being wasteful. Clearly, he would have seen that some of the seed was landing in areas that weren't going to be suitable for the plant to grow.

But now I think that's one of the primary points of the parable. The sower, (and we'll talk more about who the Sower is in the coming weeks and months,) is just throwing the seed out there. He really is, in a sense, care-less. He doesn't care if it's landing where it needs to land, his point is to just get it out there.

As Jesus expands on the parable he makes it clear that the seed the sower is putting out is the message of the gospel, the good news of Christ. So, let's ask ourselves, "What does that mean for us as disciples of Jesus in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century, when it comes to getting His message out?" What's the best way of just throwing it out there without necessarily caring about where it lands? How can we sow the seed of the Gospel like the Sower in this parable? I'm looking forward to talking about it!
