

Agricultural Terminology

Broadcasting

Broadcasting is the process of random scattering or spreading seeds on the surface of seedbeds that may or may not be incorporated into the soil or covered with soil or similar other materials.

Broadcast

"A Sower went out to sow..." (Matthew 13:3-9)

As I shared in last month's newsletter, I would like to use "The Parable of the Sower and the Seed" as the theme for our church family for 2025. There is so much we can gain from this parable, as we're finding during our Sunday morning messages. What I really want us to catch, for this year, is the method the sower/farmer used to spread the seed. He "broadcast" it.

As the picture above reminds us, the term "broadcast" was originally an agricultural term describing a kind of sowing where the seed is just cast or thrown out, broadly, onto the soil. This is exactly the kind of farming that Jesus was referring to in the Parable of the Sower.

When we hear the term "broadcast" today we naturally think of radio or television companies. We think of NBC, (the National Broadcasting Company,) or CBS, (the Colombia Broadcasting System,) or ABC, (American Broadcasting Company.) The first use of the term in this way was in the 1920's to describe radio transmissions; broadly casting out information. Now we have "simulcasts" and "podcasts" transmitting thoughts.

The idea is the same whether we're talking about broadcasting seed as a farmer or broadcasting a seed-message to a wide audience through media. The hope is that the seed will take root in good soil and grow. This is the exact metaphor that Jesus is using in the *Parable of the Sower*. When he says that the sower went out to sow, he means that he was broadly sending out a message. In the case of the parable the seed-message is "the knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven," as Jesus explains in Matthew 13:11.

While the Sower in the case of Jesus' parable is Jesus sharing the message of the kingdom to 1st Century Israel, God continues to broadcast the Good News of Jesus into the hearts of men and women, today. The amazing offer he makes to us is the invitation to join him in the broadcasting.

The guestion we can ask ourselves as a church is, "How can we utilize information technology to get the message of Jesus out to a wider audience around us?" This will be the question we'll seek to answer at our "All Church Retreat" in March, (date to be announced.) In the meantime, maybe you could let this question "germinate" in your mind and heart and then we can all broadcast our thoughts out to each other at the Retreat.
